### October 17th, 2021 - A Great Litmus Test for Doctrine



In a world filled with thousands of denominations, it can be confusing to know what to believe and what to reject. In 1 John, the apostle gives us a wonderful litmus test: the key to fellowship with God is by following what the apostles heard "from the beginning." (1:1,3) If any religious teaching today doesn't match what the apostles learned "from the beginning," it's false. For 3 reasons:

1) What's from the beginning came from God. In John's gospel, He says, "In the beginning, the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (John 1:1) In John's letter, he says the apostles heard, saw, and touched that same Word (1 John 1:1)! In the beginning, human beings weren't even around, so there would have been no trace of human, man-made doctrine! The only doctrine, the only word, was God's Word! So if the teaching we believe is "from the beginning," it means it originated with God, not man.

**2) What's from the beginning is uncorrupted.** The law of entropy says over time things fall into disorder. That's how it was in the Bible too. In Genesis 1, everything was perfectly ordered by God! But in Genesis 3, sin entered the world and spiritual entropy set in. Man twisted God's good intentions for us and His world and created their own religions by worshipping idols. Peter says, "untaught and unstable people distort the Scriptures to their own destruction." (2 Peter 3:16) The reason John starts his gospel, "In the beginning was the Word..." is to remind us of Genesis 1. Jesus is bringing a new Genesis to the world! He's coming to restore God's order back to the way it was supposed to be from the beginning. So when we believe doctrine that comes from Jesus and His apostles "from the beginning," we're returning to the pure, uncorrupted teaching of God.

**3) What's from the beginning gives life.** In Genesis, the word of God created life. All He had to do was speak, "Let there be light" — "and there was light." (Genesis 1:3). It's why John calls Jesus the "Word of life" (1 John 1:1). In John's gospel, he says about the Word, "All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being." (John 1:4). He mentions the word "life" 47 times in his gospel, because the words of Jesus that came "from the beginning" give us eternal life!

A great litmus test for doctrine is to ask, "Is this what the apostles heard and taught from the beginning?" If not, it's man-made, corrupted, and brings death. Ironically, religious groups like Jehovah's Witnesses, Mormons, 7th Day Adventists, and Muslims all argue that Christianity became corrupted, so we needed additional, later revelation from sources like the Watchtower magazine, Joseph Smith, Ellen G. White, and Muhammad. But if Christianity is corrupted, it's only because people aren't following the apostles doctrine "from the beginning." When religious groups like these introduce a "word" from God hundreds of years later that differs from what the apostles taught "from the beginning," they're doing exactly what John warned us about!

Why don't we believe in "once saved always saved?" Because it's not what was taught from the beginning. Why not subscribe to the structure and doctrines of the Roman Catholic church? Because it's not from the beginning. Why not use pianos and guitars to make the singing better? Because it's not from the beginning.

The world may look at us like we're sticks in the mud who oppose change. We may get odd looks for not being "progressive" enough. But God measures true progress by how well we stay true to His uncorrupted, lifegiving Word revealed in Jesus "from the beginning." - BM




