July 10, 2022 Fear God!

At the end of the Book of Ecclesiastes Solomon summed up everything he learned by saying, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep His commandments, For this is man's all" (Ecclesiastes 12:13). Solomon gives us more insight into fearing God in this book. He said, "For in the multitude of dreams and many words there is also vanity. But fear God" (4:7). Also, "Though a sinner does evil a hundred times, and his days are prolonged, yet I surely know that it will be well with those who fear God, who fear before Him" (8:12). The Proverb writer says that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge (1:17) and the beginning of wisdom (9:10). Fearing God is the beginning, the middle, and the end of life.

So how does one come to fear God? First, we must learn to fear God through observation. When we see His power in creation, we fear Him. "By the word of the Lord the heavens were made, And all the host of them by the breath of His mouth. He gathers the waters of the sea together as a heap; He lays up the deep in storehouses. Let all the earth fear the Lord; Let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him. For He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast (Ps 33:6-9). Not only do we learn to fear God because He has the power to create, we also learn that fearing God means standing in awe of Him. Surely observing creation makes us stand in awe of God.

Second, we learn to fear God through the teaching of others. Ps 34:11 says, "Come, you children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord." Not only should we listen to those teaching us to fear God, but me must also treasure their teachings, incline our ear to them, and apply our hearts to understanding them. We should also cry out for discernment and lift up our voices to understanding. We must seek God's wisdom as silver and hidden treasures. It is then, and only then, that you will understand the fear of the Lord (Prov 2:1-5). When we read God's book, we learn to fear Him and be in awe of Him.

What does fearing God look like in real life. In Wednesday's Bible class we looked at Shiphrah and Puah, the midwives in Exodus 1. They refused to kill the Hebrew Baby boys because they feared God. Obadiah helped save one hundred prophets from Jezebel's murderous plot because he feared God. Abraham is another great example of someone who feared God. After the angel stopped him from killing Isaac he said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me" (Genesis 22:12). People who fear God obey Him unconditionally.

Joseph feared God (Gen 42:18). Job feared God (Job 1:8). Hananiah feared God and was faithful (Neh 7:2). The penitent thief on the cross feared God (Luke 23:40). Cornelius was a devout man who feared God. As a result, he gave alms to the people and prayed diligently (Acts 10:2). Fearing God leads us to be in awe of Him, which leads to us willfully obeying Him.

It also leads to great blessings. Prov 14:26-27 says, "In the fear of the Lord there is strong confidence, And His children will have a place of refuge. The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life, To turn one away from the snares of death." Those who walk in the fear of the Lord have true inner peace!



throughout all the land of Egypt. 9 "Hurry and go up to my father, and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph: "**God** has made me lord of all Egypt; come down to me, do not tarry. 10 You shall dwell in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near to me, you and your children, your children, your flocks and your herds, and all that you have. 11 There I will provide for you, lest you and your household, and all that you have, come to poverty; for there are still five years of famine." NKJV

Joseph reconciled with his brothers the way Esau reconciled with Jacob.

Gen 45:25-28 Then they went up out of Egypt, and came to the land of Canaan to Jacob their father. 26 And they told him, saying, "Joseph is still alive, and he is governor over all the land of Egypt." And Jacob's heart stood still, because he did not believe them. 27 But when they told him all the words which Joseph had said to them, and when he saw the carts which Joseph had sent to carry him, the spirit of Jacob their father revived. 28 Then Israel said, "It is enough. Joseph my son is still alive. I will go and see him before I die." NKJV

Joseph heard Jacob credit God with his success and knew that his father would know that God was able to do

- 2. Spend as much time as you can with your kids and grandkids when they are young. What they learn before they are old enough to go to school will make a big difference in their life. Not a second of it will be wasted!

Jacob taught Joseph valuable lessons

I'm confident Joseph heard this dream

Gen 30:22-24 Then God remembered Rachel, and God listened to her and opened her womb. 23 And she conceived and bore a son, and said, "God has taken away my reproach." 24 So she called his name Joseph, and said, "The Lord shall add to me another son." NKJV

- Rachel views Joseph's birth as taking away a reproach and giving her <u>hope</u> that she would have another son.
- Every time Joseph heard his name it was a reminder of high expectations.

Gen 31:10-13 "And it happened, at the time when the flocks conceived, that I lifted my eyes and saw in a dream, and behold, the rams which leaped upon the flocks were streaked, speckled, and gray-spotted. 11 Then the Angel of God spoke to me in a dream, saying, 'Jacob.' And I said, 'Here I am.' 12 And He said, 'Lift your eyes now and see, all the rams which leap on the flocks are streaked, speckled, and gray-spotted; for I have seen all that Laban is doing to you. 13 I am the God of Bethel, where you anointed the pillar and where you made a vow to Me. Now arise, get out of this land, and return to the land of your family." NKJV

 The vow Jacob made to God was that if God would prosper him and let him return unharmed to his father's

If you will do this thing for me, I will again feed and keep your flocks: 32 Let me pass through all your flock today, removing from there all the speckled and spotted sheep, and all the brown ones among the lambs, and the spotted and speckled among the goats; and these shall be my wages. 33 **So my righteousness will answer for me** in time to come, when the subject of my wages comes before you: every one that is not speckled and spotted among the goats, and brown among the lambs, will be considered stolen, if it is with me." 34 And Laban said, "Oh, that it were according to your word!" 35 So he removed that day the male goats that were speckled and spotted, all the female goats that were speckled and spotted, every one that had some white in it, and all the brown ones among the lambs, and gave them into the hand of his sons. 36 Then he put three days' journey between himself and Jacob, and Jacob fed the rest of Laban's flocks.
